

## Journeying Towards a New Horizon

Move Minnesota works to transform the landscape of transportation in our state. As with all great journeys toward change, this work requires preparation for a positive outcome. As we reflect on 2022, the word "readiness" comes to mind. Systems change is big work, and the work of readiness—of creating and holding a vision, of building meaningful relationships, of expanding our movement and building collective power—takes time, intention, and sustained effort. So while 2022 wasn't a year full of flashy wins, it built our readiness in many critical ways.

# **2022 HIGHLIGHTS**

We completed our multi-year journeys with the communities along the C Line and Green Line to change their transportation choices. We built lasting connections through art, radio, renter resources, travel resources, a documentary (!), and more.



We pushed hard to put people first on Hennepin Avenue South in Minneapolis and overcame a mayoral veto to secure part-time dedicated bus lanes, protected bike lanes, important pedestrian improvements, and a path forward to increase bus lane hours to 24/7.



We amplified the ways transit service cuts have impacted people throughout the Twin Cities and rallied for critical solutions to boost the bus, putting pressure on Metro Transit and regional leaders to speed up service where it is needed most.



# **2022 HIGHLIGHTS**

We built critical support for public transit at the State Capitol, got Governor Walz to recognize Transit Equity Day with a formal proclamation, and passed a strong transportation bill in the Minnesota House–teeing up even greater success in 2023.

We successfully pushed the Minnesota Department of Transportation to adopt the state's first ever goal to reduce the amount people have to drive, and educated state decision-makers about what that goal could mean if they turn it into law.

We mobilized more than 20 Minnesota-based organizations to call on MnDOT and Metropolitan Council to focus federal infrastructure dollars on equity and climate resilience.

Our subsidiary organization, Move Minnesota Action, made public transit an election issue in 2022 by making our first statewide endorsements, educating and engaging state and county candidates and voters, and getting out the vote for transit champions.




